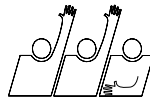

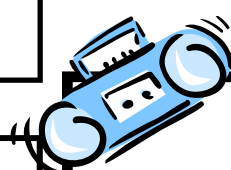

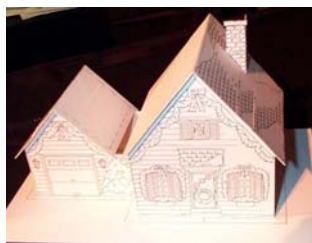

People from around the world came to Minnesota to help Dept. 56 celebrate their 25th anniversary. There was a nice group of Annapolis Villagers among those attending this gala affair. The Angeluccis, Baers, Baldwins, Dvoraks, Eustices, Myers, Roberts, Voigts as well as Norma Damico, Pat Fusco, Maureen Reed and Bernice Smith were seen enjoying the festivities. All day Friday one was able to attend the various tours you had pre-registered for. These tours included the Sternwheeler Boat Trip, Christmas Showcase House, Mall of America tour, D56 Showroom tour, Stillwater tour and the Cathedral of St. Paul tour. The opening ceremony was held at Rice Park. The CEO of Dept 56 Susan Engel gave a brief speech and turned the show over to a local DJ who in turn introduced pop singer Leslie Gore as the entertainment for the rest of the evening.

Saturday had all the tours running as well as a variety of other events taking place at the River Center. You could have taken in a lecture/demonstration by Carter Rodenhizer (tricks of the trade), Rick Jackson (anatomy of a village), Ray Leiker (tree trimming tricks and holiday décor), Ken Hoyt (stress free holidays), or Tom Hemmingway & Jill Schlung (changing seasons).

If you chose not to attend a lecture at a particular time, you could have ventured into the ballroom to view the incredible displays for each village, enjoyed the display contest with its approximately 40 entries, or had a Snow Angel signed by Elaine Roesle. Out side the ballroom, you were treated to glass blowing and cake decorating. The cake decorations, performed by Lynn K. Vinge, had the following themes, A Snowbaby Birthday, A Snowbunnies Egg Ornament, Halloween Treats, North Pole gingerbread, Billy Buttons, and Dickens Candle. Also outside the ballroom, you were asked to sign the huge banner (about 8' x 20'). Our group attended a performance by Gerald Charles Dickens, the great great grandson of Charles Dickens. It was very entertaining and Mr. Dickens was gracious enough to autograph a keepsake program and have his picture taken with you.

To close out Saturday, D56 had a gala banquet at the Minnesota Museum of Natural History. The event took up three floors plus the terrace areas. The entertainment on each floor varied and the buffet style dinner featured a different cuisine for each village station. Guest was asked to dress up in a costume of any D56 village and the turn out was incredible. People really went all out for this part of the program and it was a lot of fun to see the various outfits.

To A House

Attendees at the D56 Silver Anniversary were treated to a quick overview of how a idea becomes a reality. We saw D56 artists make models of houses out of heavy paper from design drawings. The artists also drew all of the adornments on the paper models—flowers, window boxes, lattice, vines on the house, gutters, cornices, etc. The paper model is then sent to another artist who hand sculpts a wax model from the paper model design. Lastly, a mold is cast from the model design. Once the actual houses are made from the molds, an artist hand paints the house and the adornments. It was fascinating to watch.

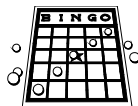

To compliment our "Umbrella" theme of the past two years, the NCC together with Department 56 is pleased to announce the introduction of "Jack's Umbrella Shop". As an exclusive porcelain lighted piece, this shop pays tribute to the work of Jack Skeels, who was instrumental in the formation of the National Council of 56 Clubs which, as you know, was formed as an **"umbrella"** organization for Department 56 clubs.

The two piece set includes a porcelain accessory, "Is it Raining?". The building size is approximately 7 1/4" in height from base to chimney. It will be available to NCC members only and will retail at a member price of \$56.00 (US) including shipping. At the Rt. 2 N and Jones Station Rd intersection (Amoco and Crown gas Stations), turn right onto Jones Station Rd and make an immediate left onto Manhattan Beach Rd which is behind the Crown Station. Follow Manhattan Beach Rd approximately two tenths of a mile. Make a left into the parking lot of The American Legion Post 175. The entrance to the Banquet Room is to the left side of the parking lot in the rear.
