Snow Village had the first "working man" accessory. It was "Home Delivery, D56 Item # 51624. "Home Delivery" consist of a Milk Man with a Milk Delivery Truck. "Home Delivery" was issued in 1990, 14 years after the introduction of Snow Village, and retired in 1992. Since then, New England, Christmas in the City as well as Snow Village have added many trade and labor people "working men & women" to the village scene.

In virtually every country in the world, with the notable exceptions being the United States, Canada, Australia and New Zealand, Labor Day is celebrated on May 1, May Day. So, Dickens, Alpine and maybe North Pole collectors, you have a few months until your Labor Day.

CHEF'S CORNER BY BERNIE DVORAK



Those who had so much fun at the Watson's Annapolis Villagers Picnic, may have also enjoyed these two treats: *Jennifer Collinson's Pecan Pie & Bernie Dvorak's Steamship Round of Beef.*

Here are the recipes.

BERNIE'S STEAMSHIP ROUND OF BEEF

- ◆ Begin with 5 lb (choice or prime) *Top Round Roast of Beef.*
- ◆ Add 2 cups rice vinegar, 3 TBL Worchester sauce, 3 TBL Old Bay seasoning, 2TBL dry mustard to a 4" deep pan. Marinate meat for 4 to 6 hours, rotating every hour.
- ◆ Prepare charcoal grill (gas grill does not qualify) for indirect method of grilling.
- ◆ Insert meat thermometer & set at 125°F - 130°F for medium rare, 150°F - 170°F for medium well.

(CAUTION: Beef cooked "well done" is best used as pet food!)

- ◆ Slice thin across the grain at a 40° angle.

JENNIFER'S PECAN PIE By Jennifer Collinson

- ◆ 1 Pie Crust
- ◆ 3 eggs
- ◆ 2/3 cup sugar
- ◆ 1 cup dark corn syrup
- ◆ 1/3 cup melted butter or margarine
- ◆ 1 cup pecan halves
- ◆ 1/2 tsp salt
- ◆ Preheat oven at 350 degrees.
- ◆ Put crust on a 9 inch oven proof pie plate.

FILLING:

- ◆ Beat eggs slightly in a mixing bowl.
- ◆ Add sugar & salt. Stir until dissolved.
- ◆ Stir in dark corn syrup & melted butter. Mix well.
- ◆ Fold in pecan halves.
- ◆ Pour filling into pie crust and bake about 50 minutes or until knife inserted off-center, comes out clean.
- ◆ Cool on a rack.
- ◆ *Best served hot, with whipped cream or a la mode.*

Meetings Held At American Legion Post 175

Unless otherwise noted, all Annapolis Villagers' Membership Meetings and Board Meetings are held at The American Legion, Post 175, Severna Park in Manhattan Beach. Meetings start at 7 P.M.

From Rt. 50, take Rt. 2 North exit. Follow Rt. 2 N (Ritchie Highway) through Arnold. After the traffic light at Rt. 2 and College Parkway, the next light is Jones Station Rd. At the Rt. 2 N and Jones Station Rd intersection (BP and Texaco gas Stations), turn right onto Jones Station Rd and make an immediate left onto Manhattan Beach Rd, which is behind the Texaco Station. Follow Manhattan Beach Rd approximately two tenths of a mile. Make a left into the parking lot of The American Legion Post 175. The entrance to the Banquet Room is to the left side of the parking lot in the rear.

From Baltimore Beltway, take Rt. 2 S. Follow Rt. 2 S (Ritchie Highway) through Severna Park. At Jones Station Rd, make a left. From Jones Station Rd., proceed as above.
